items you will need:

Tear-away stabilizer

Thread that coordinates with the cardstock

Precut heavy weight 5" X 7" cards or 4.25" X 5.5"

Envelopes

Cardstock to cover the back of the embroidery

Embellishments

Double-sided tape or glue

Card design of your choice

Hint: Print a greeting inside the card before embroidery.

- 1. Hoop one piece of tear-away stabilizer.
- 2. Embroider first color, this is the area to place the card. Put one small piece of double-sided tape in the center of the embroidered rectangle on the tear-away stabilizer.
- 3. Open the card. Lay the card in the rectangle front side up and the back of the card to the left.
- 4. Embroider design.
- 5. Remove from hoop. Gently pull the tear-away from the back of the card.
- 6. Cut cardstock .25" smaller then the card front to adhere to the back of the embroidered card.
- 7. Add embellishments.
- 8. Stamp greeting inside of card if desired.

Embellishment ideas

- · Brads use a paper hole punch to make an opening for the brad. There are a wide variety of brads, if you are having a hard time finding a brad that will coordinate with your paper paint the plain silver or gold that you can find at your local office store.
- Ribbon
- · Embellish cardstock with coordinating stickers.
- · Stamp cardstock with coordinating images and lettering.
- · Emboss cardstock with coordinating images and lettering.
- · Cut envelopes from lightweight cardstock with or with out a pattern. Envelope templates come in a variety of sizes.
- · The items listed above are available at most craft stores.
- · Precut cards, cardstock and envelopes may be available at your local print shop.
