Spring Twitter Back Pack and Sweatshirt

Items you will need:

Back pack or pattern and items listed

Sweatshirt or pattern and items listed

Fabric scraps for the applique

Cut away stabilizer

Spray adhesive

Chalk wheel

Designs CH3072 for the back pack, CH3071 and FL1753 for the sweatshirt


Applique Information:

1. The outline stitch will define where the applique fabric will be placed.
2. Cut the applique fabric at least 1 inch larger than the outline stitch.
3. Place the applique fabric, topside up, over outline stitch. Make sure the fabric covers the outline stitch. Spray adhesive will help hold the fabric in place.
4. Sew the tack down stitch. This running stitch will hold the applique fabric in place.
5. Carefully trim the fabric on the outside of the tack down line as close as possible to the stitches.
6. Stitch the remaining color changes of the design.

Embroider the Back Pack and Sweatshirt

1. Use the chalk wheel to mark the center of the design where it will be embroidered.
2. Hoop the back pack/sweatshirt with cut away stabilizer.
3. Embroider/applique the design.
4. Remove from the hoop.
5. Carefully trim the stabilizer close to the design.





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Spring Twitter Bath Towels

Items you will need:

Towels

Fabric scraps for the applique

Fibrous water soluble stabilizer

Spray adhesive

Chalk wheel

Designs CH3068, CH3067, and CH3066


Applique Information:

1. The outline stitch will define where the applique fabric will be placed.
2. Cut the applique fabric at least 1 inch larger than the outline stitch.
3. Place the applique fabric, topside up, over outline stitch. Make sure the fabric covers the outline stitch. Spray adhesive will help hold the fabric in place.
4. Sew the tack down stitch. This running stitch will hold the applique fabric in place.
5. Carefully trim the fabric on the outside of the tack down line as close as possible to the stitches.
6. Stitch the remaining color changes of the design.

Embroider Towels

1. Use the chalk wheel to mark the center of the design where it will be embroidered.
2. Hoop the towel with fibrous water soluble stabilizer.
3. Embroider/applique the design.
4. Remove from the hoop.
5. Remove the fibrous water soluble stabilizer.
6. Repeat to finish the towel set.





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Spring Twitter Dress and Back Pack

Items you will need:

Back pack or pattern and items listed

Dress or pattern and items listed

Fabric scraps for the applique

Cut away stabilizer

Spray adhesive

Chalk wheel

Designs CH3073 for the back pack and CH3074 for the dress


Applique Information:

1. The outline stitch will define where the applique fabric will be placed.
2. Cut the applique fabric at least 1 inch larger than the outline stitch.
3. Place the applique fabric, topside up, over outline stitch. Make sure the fabric covers the outline stitch. Spray adhesive will help hold the fabric in place.
4. Sew the tack down stitch. This running stitch will hold the applique fabric in place.
5. Carefully trim the fabric on the outside of the tack down line as close as possible to the stitches.
6. Stitch the remaining color changes of the design.

Embroider the Back Pack and Dress

1. Use the chalk wheel to mark the center of the design where it will be embroidered.
2. Hoop the back pack/dress with cut away stabilizer.
3. Embroider/applique the design.
4. Remove from the hoop.
5. Carefully trim the stabilizer close to the design.





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Spring Twitter Place mat and Napkin

Items you will need for 4 place mats and 4 napkins:

Low loft quilt batting

¼ yd. Turquoise fabric

¼ yd. Pink fabric

⅛ yd. Green fabric

1½ yd. Yellow fabric for the center of the place mats and the napkins

1½ yd. Print fabric on the edges and the back of the place mat

Cut away stabilizer

Fibrous water soluble stabilizer

Spray adhesive

Chalk wheel

Design CH3064 for the place mat and FL1750 for the napkin

Applique Information:

1. The outline stitch will define where the applique fabric will be placed.
2. Cut the applique fabric at least 1 inch larger than the outline stitch.
3. Place the applique fabric, topside up, over outline stitch. Make sure the fabric covers the outline stitch. Spray adhesive will help hold the fabric in place.
4. Sew the tack down stitch. This running stitch will hold the applique fabric in place.
5. Carefully trim the fabric on the outside of the tack down line as close as possible to the stitches.
6. Stitch the remaining color changes of the design.

Use ½" seam to assemble the place mat.

1. Cut the fabric: Turquoise fabric, four 16" X 3½". Pink fabric, four 16" X 3½". Green fabric, eight, 6" X 3½". Yellow fabric, four 11" X 6" for the embroidery, and four 20" X 20" for the napkins. Print fabric, eight 11" X 3½" for the sides eight 21" X 3½" for the top and bottom, and four 16" X 21" for the backs of the place mats.

2. Mark the center of the yellow piece of fabric for the place mat.
3. Hoop the fabric with two pieces of cut away stabilizer.
4. Embroider/applique the design.
5. Remove from hoop.
6. Trim the cut away stabilizer close to embroidered design.
7. Lay the quilt squares/strips out in order. See photos on the following page.
8. Stitch the squares together.
9. Press seams.
10. Lay the back front side up, quilt side down, and the batting on the top.
11. Stitch outside edges together leaving an opening to turn right side out.
12. Turn right side out, stitch opening closed.
13. Stitch ¼" in from the outside edges.
14. Stitch in the ditch.

Napkin

1. Wind bobbins with coordinating thread (the back of the napkin will be visible).
2. Mark center of design on the corner of the napkin.
3. Hoop the corner of the napkin with two pieces of fibrous water soluble backing.
4. Embroider design.
5. Remove from hoop.
6. Hem the outside edges of the napkin.
7. Remove the water soluble backing.




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Spring Twitter Table Runner

Items you will need:

Low loft quilt batting

¼ yd. Turquoise fabric

¼ yd. Pink fabric

⅛ yd. Green fabric

½ yd. Yellow fabric

1 ½ yd. Print fabric for the sides of the top and the back

Cut away stabilizer

Spray adhesive

Chalk wheel

Designs CH3065 and FL1752

Applique Information:

1. The outline stitch will define where the applique fabric will be placed.
2. Cut the applique fabric at least 1 inch larger than the outline stitch.
3. Place the applique fabric, topside up, over outline stitch. Make sure the fabric covers the outline stitch. Spray adhesive will help hold the fabric in place.
4. Sew the tack down stitch. This running stitch will hold the applique fabric in place.
5. Carefully trim the fabric on the outside of the tack down line as close as possible to the stitches.
6. Stitch the remaining color changes of the design.

Use ½" seam to assemble the table runner.

1. Cut the fabric: Turquoise fabric, four 3½" X 16". Pink fabric, four 3½" X 16". Green fabric, two 3½" X 16". Yellow fabric, one 3½" X 16", and two 11" X 16". Print fabric, two 3½" X 16" two 3½" X 53½" this will need to be pieced together and the backing will need to be 16" X 53½" this will also need to be pieced together.
2. Mark the center of the yellow piece of fabric for the

place mat.

3. Hoop the fabric with two pieces of cut away stabilizer.
4. Embroider the design.
5. Remove from hoop.
6. Trim the cut away stabilizer close to embroidered design.
7. Repeat for the other end of the table runner.
8. Lay the quilt squares out in order. See photos on the following page.
9. Stitch the strips together.
10. Press seams.
11. Lay the back front side up, quilt side down, and the batting on the top.
12. Stitch outside edges together leaving an opening to turn right side out.
13. Turn right side out, stitch opening closed.
14. Stitch ¼" in from the outside edges.
15. Stitch in the ditch.



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Yellow strip is the center of the table runner.





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Spring Twitter Tic-Tac-Toe Picnic Quilt

Items you will need:

Low loft quilt batting

1 yd. Orange fabric

1 yd. Purple fabric

¾ yd. Pink fabric

½ yd. Green fabric for the squares and the accent between the pink and floral fabric

2 ¾ yd. Print fabric for the quilt strips and the back

Cut away stabilizer

Spray adhesive

Chalk wheel or pencil

Quilt pins

Designs CH3065, CH3068, CH3070, CH3072, CH3074, FL1754, FL1756, FL1758, and FL1760

Applique Information:

1. The outline stitch will define where the applique fabric will be placed.
2. Cut the applique fabric at least 1 inch larger than the outline stitch.
3. Place the applique fabric, topside up, over outline stitch. Make sure the fabric covers the outline stitch. Spray adhesive will help hold the fabric in place.
4. Sew the tack down stitch. This running stitch will hold the applique fabric in place.
5. Carefully trim the fabric on the outside of the tack down line as close as possible to the stitches.
6. Stitch the remaining color changes of the design.

Use ½" seam to assemble the quilt.

1. Cut the fabric: Orange fabric, nine 11" X 11" for the embroidered squares. Purple fabric, six 6" X 11" and two 6" X 41". Pink fabric, four 6" X 41". Green fabric, four 6" X 6" for the corner squares and four 1½" X 51" for the accent between the pink and floral fabric

(this will need to be pieced then cut). Print fabric, two 6" X 51" for the sides, two 6" X 61" for the top and bottom, one 61" X 61" for the back (all off the print fabric will need to be pieced then cut).

2. Mark the center of the 11" X 11" squares.
3. Hoop the 11" X 11" square with two pieces of cut away stabilizer.
4. Embroider the design.
5. Remove from hoop.
6. Trim cut away stabilizer close to embroidered design.
7. Repeat to embroider the remaining squares.
8. Lay the quilt squares/strips out in order. See photos on the following page.
9. Stitch the squares/strips together, lay the accent on the outside edge of the pink strips and green squares before you stitch the print strips.
10. Press seams as you stitch the squares and strips together.
11. Lay the back front side up, quilt side down, and the batting on the top.
12. Stitch outside leaving an opening to turn right side out.
13. Turn right side out, stitch opening closed.
14. Stitch in the ditch or quilt as you like.

Tic-Tac-Toe Pieces.

Items you will need:

Five 5½" X 5½" pieces of pink fabric for the top

Five 5½" X 5½" pieces of green fabric for the top


Ten 5½" X 5½" pieces of fabric for the back

Tear away stabilizer

Spray adhesive

Designs NFC0069 and NFC0070

1. Hoop tear away stabilizer.




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2. Stitch the outline stitches.
3. Spray the stabilizer with the spray adhesive, adhere the "top" fabric to the stabilizer.
4. Stitch the tack down stitches.
5. Trim the fabric close to the stitches.
6. Embroider the design through the last outline stitch.
7. Remove the hoop from the machine.
8. Lay the hoop with the back up.
9. Spray the stabilizer with the spray adhesive, adhere the "back" fabric to the stabilizer over the outline stitches.
10. Tape the edges of the fabric to the stabilizer, the fabric will stay in place.
11. Put the hoop on the machine, sew the tack down stitches.
12. Remove the hoop from the machine and trim the fabric close to the tack down stitches.
13. Embroider the last color.
14. Gently remove the tear away stabilizer.





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Spring Twitter Counter Top Appliance Cover and Trivet

Items you will need:

Appliance covers or pattern and items listed

Cut away stabilizer

Chalk wheel

Fabric for the trivet: 8" X 8" for the center, two 2" X 8" for the top and bottom edges for the center piece, 2" X 10½" for the side edges for the center piece., and one 10½" x 10½" thermal for the back.

Design CH3064 for the toaster cover and CH3069 for the trivet

Applique Information:

1. The outline stitch will define where the applique fabric will be placed.
2. Cut the applique fabric at least 1 inch larger than the outline stitch.
3. Place the applique fabric, topside up, over outline stitch. Make sure the fabric covers the outline stitch. Spray adhesive will help hold the fabric in place.
4. Sew the tack down stitch. This running stitch will hold the applique fabric in place.
5. Carefully trim the fabric on the outside of the tack down line as close as possible to the stitches.
6. Stitch the remaining color changes of the design.

Embroider the Counter Top Appliance Cover and Trivet


1. Cut fabric for the trivet (listed above) and appliance covers.
2. Use the chalk wheel to mark the center of the design where it will be embroidered. We centered the design on the 8" X 8" fabric for the trivet.
3. Hoop the appliance cover front/8" X 8" fabric for the trivet with cut away stabilizer.
4. Embroider/applique the design.
5. Remove from the hoop.
6. Carefully trim the stabilizer close to the design.

7. Assemble the appliance covers as noted on the pattern instructions.

Assemble the trivet as noted below:

1. Stitch the 2" X 8" pieces of fabric to the top and bottom of the embroidered center piece.
2. Press seams.
3. Stitch the 2" X 10½" pieces of fabric to the sides of the embroidered center piece.
4. Press seams.
5. Lay the embroidered top pieces and the 10½" x 10½" thermal back piece front sides together.
6. Stitch outside edges together leaving and opening to turn right side out.
7. Turn right side out, stitch opening closed.
8. Stitch in the ditch.





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
